Task:

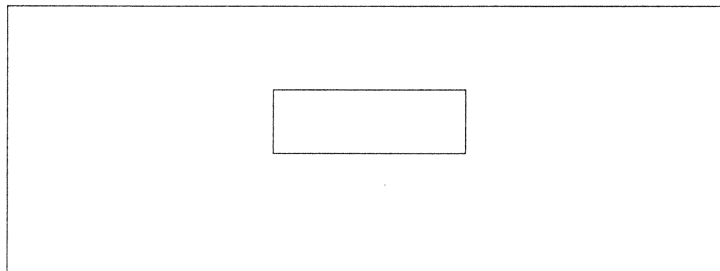

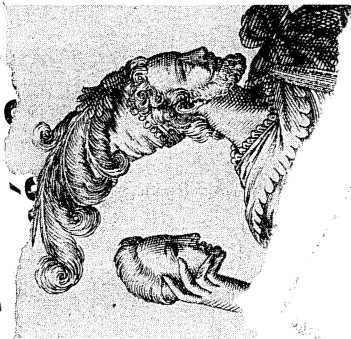

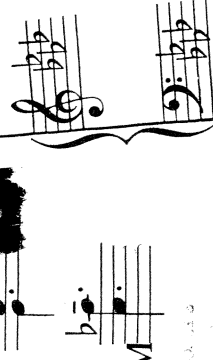
